



**Alwyn Jordan** is the Deputy Governor of the Central Bank of Barbados, with responsibility for the Bank's Research and Economic Analysis and Bank Supervision departments. He also chairs a number of the Bank's internal committees. A former Manager of the Research Department in the Central Bank of The Bahamas, Mr. Jordan returned to Barbados in 2019, after the country entered into the first Extended Fund Facility (EFF) programme with the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

He has published a number of articles on topics such as pension financing, current account deficits and the impact of non-performing loans on economic growth in both regional and international journals. His current research interests include: monetary policy issues, macro-prudential policy developments, currency regimes, and economic forecasting.
